

## NOTICE

### A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF CONSTRUCTING THE BLUEPRINT WATERLINE INITIATIVE PROJECT NO. 5-W-15 FOR THE TRUMBULL COUNTY METROPOLITAN SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT

The Board of County Commissioners of Trumbull County, Ohio, met in Regular Session on Wednesday, February 28, 2018, commencing at 10:30 a.m. at the Niles Wellness Center, 213 Sharkey Road, Niles, Ohio 44446, with the following members present:

Commissioner Fuda offered the following preambles and resolution and moved their adoption, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Cantalamessa:

WHEREAS, on the instructions of this Board, the County Sanitary Engineer has heretofore prepared, or caused to be prepared detailed design drawings, estimates of cost and tentative capital charges and service connection fees for the Blueprint Waterline Initiative Project which is hereinafter referred to and which, in the opinion of this Board, it is presently necessary to construct for the Trumbull County Metropolitan Sanitary Sewer District in accordance with the available and approved general plan of water distribution works therefore;

WHEREAS, the Project, which is designated here as No. 5-W-15, shall consist of the construction of water distribution lines, together with all necessary appurtenances thereto in portions of Braceville, Southington and Farmington Townships. Furthermore, repairs to the Village of West Farmington Public Water System will be performed. Furthermore, an aboveground Water Storage Tank and Booster Pump Station will be constructed as part of the project;

WHEREAS, the detailed design drawings, estimates of cost, tentative capital charges, water rates and service connection fees for Project 5-W-15 have been filed with this Board and are hereby approved, ratified and confirmed and copies of the detailed design drawings, estimates of cost, and tentative capital charges, water rates and service connection fees are on file in the office of the Sanitary Engineer of this County and are available for examination therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Trumbull County, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is necessary at this time for the purpose of preserving, protecting and promoting the public health and welfare to construct the water distribution lines, make repairs to the West Farmington PWS, construct an aboveground water storage tank and booster pump station together with all necessary appurtenances thereto, described herein above and as outlined in the detailed design drawings and herein before referred to as being Project 5-W-15 for the Trumbull County Metropolitan Sanitary Sewer District.

Section 2. That the entire cost of constructing Project No. 5-W-15 not covered by grant funds shall be paid by the beneficiaries of the project in the form of rates, capital charges

and service connection fees within the Metropolitan Sanitary Sewer District that are described as all those properties bounding and abutting upon the Project who have requested a service connection as determined by the Trumbull County Sanitary Engineer.

Section 3. That the 29th day of March, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. shall be and is hereby fixed, as the time and the Southington School, 2482 State Route 534, Southington, Ohio 44470, as the place for hearing of objections to or acceptance of Project 5-W-15, to the tentative rates, capital charges and service connection fees thereto or to the boundaries of the project for same and as outlined below.

The Blueprint Waterline Initiative Project is generally described as the construction of a water distribution system together with all necessary appurtenances thereto, and the location and route of the project begins at an existing 10" diameter ductile iron water line near the intersection of Braceville Robinson Road and State Route 82 in Braceville Township and extends north within the public right-of-way of Braceville Robinson Road approximately 18,100 linear feet to the intersection of Helsely Fusselman Road; Thence, extending west within the public right-of way of Helsely Fusselman Road approximately 4,100 linear feet to the intersection of State Route 534; Thence, extending north within the public right-of way of State Route 534 approximately 35,000 linear feet through portions of Southington Township and Farmington Township to the connection point of the West Farmington PWS which is approximately 1,800 linear feet south of the intersection of SR534 and SR88; Furthermore, beginning at the Southington Estates Mobile Home Park located at 4668 Herner County Line Road and extending east within the public right-of way of Herner County Line Road approximately 8,000 linear feet to the intersection of Leiby Osborne Road; Thence, extending north within the public right-of way of Leiby Osborne Road approximately 700 linear feet to the intersection of Warren Burton Road; Furthermore, beginning at the intersection of State Route 534 and US Route 422 and extending northwest within the public right-of way of US Route 422 approximately 6,000 linear feet to the intersection of State Route 305; Thence, extending east within the public right-of way of State Route 305 approximately 8,500 linear feet to the intersection of Barclay Messerly Road; Thence, extending south within the public right-of way of Barclay Messerly Road approximately 8,400 linear feet to the intersection of Warren Burton Road; Thence, extending northwest within the public right-of way of Warren Burton Road approximately 13,400 linear feet to the intersection of State Route 534. Furthermore, beginning at the intersection of Warren Burton Road and US Route 422 and extending southeast within the public right-of-way of US Route 422 approximately 2,900 linear feet to the intersection of US Route 422 and Anna Court; Thence, extending north within the public right-of-way of Anna Court approximately 1,560 linear feet to the intersection with William Street; Thence, extending west within the William Street public right-of-way approximately 50 linear feet to the intersection with Will Anna Court; Thence, extending north, then west within the Will Anna Court public right-of-way approximately 670 linear feet to termination. Furthermore, beginning at the intersection of Anna Court and Williams Street and extending west within the Williams Street public right-of-way approximately 350 linear feet to termination; Furthermore, beginning at the intersection of Anna Court and Williams Street and extending east within the Williams Street public right-of-way approximately 500 linear feet to termination; Furthermore, beginning at the intersection of SR534 and Helsley Fusselman Road and extending south within the SR534 public right-of-way approximately 3,300 linear feet to termination. The scope of the project also includes approximately 137 fire hydrants, 162 gate valves, 12 sampling stations/flushing assemblies, 1 booster pump station, 1 water quality treatment

unit, 1 aboveground water storage tank, 3 master meter pits, 1 pressure reducing valve, 969 service connection assemblies and 320 radio water meters to replace the existing water meters within the Village of West Farmington. Furthermore, the storage tank within the West Farmington PWS is to be retrofitted with an aeration system and power vent to maintain water quality.

Section 4. That the Clerk of this Board hereby is directed to have a notice of that hearing published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper published and of general circulation in Trumbull County, the first such publication to be made at least twenty-four (24) days prior to the hearing date fixed in Section 3 hereof, and, on or before the date of the second publication of that notice, to mail a copy of the notice to every owner of property for which a service connection is planned for Project No. 5-W-15 whose address is known and such notices shall state that the property of the addressee may be subject to service connection fees and capital charges by this County for Project No. 5-W-15.

Section 5. That the County Sanitary Engineer hereby is authorized and directed to review any timely written objections that may be filed with this Board with respect to Project 5-W-15 and to make recommendations to this Board concerning the disposition of any such objections.

Section 6. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were so adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board, and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the rates.
